Daniel Weibel has a position as assistant professor in the group of Prof. Miriam Sturkenboom at Erasmus Medical Center (EMC) in Rotterdam as vaccine-pharmacoepidemiologist. Since 2004, he has been gathering experience in the field of vaccine-epidemiology starting with a PhD at the Swiss Tropical Institute assessing childhood vaccine compliance and effects in nomadic Saharan populations in Chad. Followed by a two year assignment at the Brighton Collaboration Foundation being actively involved in the creation of the WHO vaccine safety blueprint guiding document and the coordination of ECDC's VAESCO project on risks of A(N1H1) pandemic flu vaccines. Since mid-year 2011, he has been working at EMC active in several international multi-center projects and vaccine safety studies (e.g., ADVANCE WP2-3-4-5, GRiP, PREVENT, Vaccine.GRID, ADVANCE, SOMNIA). The activities are focusing on vaccine safety studies (e.g., CDC SOMNIA study on narcolepsy following A(H1N1) vaccines) and evaluating data and infrastructural capacities of centers in high and low income countries to potentially enable them in multi-center vaccine safety studies (GRiP, PREVENT, WHO GVS-MCC).
