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Mirjana Nesin, MD, FAAP is Senior Medical Officer at the Office of Clinical Research Resources (OCRR) at the Division of Microbiology and Infectious Diseases (DMID) at the National Institute of Allergy and Infectious Diseases (NIAID) of the National Institutes of Health (NIH).

Dr. Nesin participates in designing and implementation of DMID funded clinical studies of antimicrobials and vaccines. Some of these trials enroll pregnant women and their infants including low-and middle-income countries (LMIC).

She was one of organizers of consultative conferences to DMID/NIH on knowledge gaps and opportunities for clinical research in pregnancy. Significant part of these conferences was focused on developing research tools to assess safety of vaccines administered to pregnant women.

Before coming to NIH Dr. Nesin was an academic neonatologist. Her research and publications were related to antibiotic resistance and neonatal infections and immunity.

Dr. Nesin is a member of the Brighton Collaboration and a participant in Work Package 2 of the GAIA project.
