Dr. Pedro Moro is a medical epidemiologist with the Vaccine Adverse Reporting System (VAERS) Project and Response Team at the Immunization Safety Office (ISO) at CDC. His work involves the surveillance of adverse events following vaccination using the VAERS system. He particularly concentrates in the safety of Hib, pertussis containing, and the cell-based influenza vaccines. He also leads many activities in safety monitoring of vaccines in pregnant women which has resulted in several publications that looked at the safety the 2009 H1N1 influenza vaccines, Tdap, Hepatitis A, and Meningococcal vaccines in pregnancy. Dr. Moro is originally from Peru where he graduated from Universidad Cayetano Heredia medical school in Lima. In 2000, he received his Masters of Public Health from the Johns Hopkins School of Public Health. Prior to coming to CDC, Dr. Moro worked in the epidemiology of parasitic diseases in Peru.
